

What to expect at your consultation with one of our medicolegal experts

We know that seeing a new clinician can be a little daunting. Our experts understand this. Please remember that our doctors carry out physical examinations of many patients every week in their private and NHS clinics, as well as in their medicolegal practice. They will do all they can to put you at ease.

Follow our checklist below to make sure you're prepared for your consultation:

What you need to bring to the consultation

- ☐ Photo identification (passport, driving licence, i.d. photo card)
- ☐ Utility bill or bank statement (no more than 3 months old) showing the same name and address as that provided to us by your solicitor.
- ☐ The doctor will want to know what medication you are taking. Some patients find it easier to either bring the medication or a list of the medication (including dosage).
- ☐ If you have photos of scars, the accident site or post-surgery that you would the doctor to consider, please email them to info@medicolegal-partners.com ahead of the appointment.
- ☐ If a translator is attending with you, your solicitor will arrange for them to bring I.D. with them.

Before the consultation

- ☐ Plan your journey - full details about clinic locations are on our website under ***Claimant Information***
- ☐ If you would like to be accompanied by a friend or relative, please ask your solicitor to give us permission for this in writing in advance.

On the day

- ☐ Arrive at least 15 minutes in advance
- ☐ Wear loose clothing so that it is easier for the doctor to carry out a physical examination of the site/s of your pain or injury.
